- (1) **Above Enrollment: 155 students for Bachelor's degree, 3 students for the Master's degree.**
- (2) **Applicants are allowed only one registration.**
- (3) **The above enrollment quota is the total number of students for the spring semester and Fall Semester combined.**
- (4) **The application for master's program will be evaluated by both the Department of Finance, the Department of Business Management and the Department of Information Technology, and the best will be admitted.**
- (5) **Duration of study: 4 to 6 years for a Bachelor's degree program; 1 to 4 years for a Master's degree.**
- (6) **Mandarin Chinese is the medium of instruction. Applicants should have adequate listening, reading, speaking and writing proficiency in Chinese at a level sufficient for academic studies. Applicants who are not proficient in Mandarin should take extra related language courses.**

2. Eligibility

(1) Nationality

- a. International students shall be defined as individuals who have never held Republic of China (Taiwan) nationality nor have had Overseas Chinese student status.
- b. Individuals who hold foreign nationalities and have stayed abroad for more than 6 years (up to August 1, 2024) and who are qualified for one of the following situations are considered as international students.
 - (a) Individuals holding both foreign and R.O.C. nationalities but have never had household registration in Taiwan.
 - (b) Individuals holding foreign nationality and once had R.O.C. nationality but his or her household registration had been revoked by the Ministry of Interior for at least 8 years (up to August 1, 2024).
 - (c) The above individuals who have never held Overseas Chinese student status or studied in Taiwan nor have received a student status by University Entrance Committee for Overseas Chinese in the enrollment year.

Students who are recommended by foreign governments, organizations, or schools, according to educational cooperation agreements, are approved by the educational supervisory institutions, and have never held Republic of China (Taiwan) household registration.

- c. An applicant holding foreign nationality, concurrently holding a permanent residence status in Hong Kong or Macao, has never been registered as part of a household in Taiwan and, at the time of application, has continuously resided in Hong Kong, Macao, or another foreign country (overseas) for no less than 6 years is qualified to apply for admission under these regulations.
- d. An applicant who is a former citizen of Mainland China, currently holds a foreign nationality, has never been registered as part of a household in Taiwan and, at the time of application, has continuously resided overseas for no less than 6 years is qualified to apply for admission under these regulations.
- e. The term “overseas” as prescribed in Paragraph b, c, and d is limited to countries or regions other than Mainland China, Hong Kong, and Macau. The phrase “continuously reside overseas” means that an individual may stay in Taiwan for no more than a total of 120 days per calendar year. If the period of continuously living overseas does not conform to an academic year, the amount of time spent overseas shall be calculated as a maximum of 120 days. The only exceptions to this method of calculation are for

those who fulfill one of the following requirements with written supported proof:

- (a) Attended overseas youth training courses organized by the Overseas Compatriot Affairs Council or technique training classes accredited by the Ministry of Education.
- (b) Attended a Mandarin Chinese language center at a university/college of which foreign student recruitment is approved by the Ministry, and to which the total length of stay is less than 2 years.
- (c) Exchange students whose length of total exchange is less than 2 years.
- (d) An Internship in Taiwan which has been approved by an authorized central government agency, to which the total length of stay is less than 2 years.

(2) Education Background

International students who graduate from a high school, college, or university which is recognized by the Taiwan Ministry of Education are eligible to apply for admission.

- a. Students who graduated from high schools are eligible to apply for four-year undergraduate programs.
- b. Students with bachelor degrees are eligible to apply for graduate studies in master's degree programs.
- c. Individuals who meet the regulations stipulated in the Standards for Recognition of Equivalent Educational Level as Qualified for Entering University shall be considered to have an adequate level of education to register for the new student enrollment entrance examination.

* Those having completed study at an equivalent foreign or Hong Kong/Macau high school which is equal to the sophomore or senior high school in Taiwan may apply to the undergraduate program at OCU and the University shall increase 12 credits for graduation to complete their study.

3. Application Instructions

- (1) Application Deadline: Jun. 5, 2024 (Fall semester) or Nov. 29, 2024 (Spring semester).
- (2) How to Apply: Online <http://apply.ocu.edu.tw/international>
- (3) Application Fee: (We do not accept applications from those who do not pay the application fee.)
 - a. \$35 USD or \$1,000 TWD.
 - b. If paying in TWD, the applicant will have to purchase a postal money order of \$1,000 TWD. The recipient of the postal money order is Overseas



Chinese University (written in Chinese 僑光科技大學). Send the postal money order along with all of the application documents to OCU.

- c. If paying in USD, the application fee should be remitted to OCU's bank account (Remittance fees should be paid by applicants). Please enclose a copy of your bank's electronic transfer receipt along with the other documents.

(4) Required Documents

- a. One application form with a personal photo attached. The photo should be taken within 3 months of application submission. (see **Appendix 2**)
- b. Documents related to nationality certification (ID card) and a photocopy of passport (photo page), and:

- (a) If the applicant has foreign nationality at the time of application and has not had the nationality of the Republic of China, he/she should submit relevant documents for continuous residence abroad (and have been continuously overseas for more than six years at the time of application).

- (b) If the applicant has foreign nationality and the nationality of the Republic of China at the time of application, he/she should never have a household registration in Taiwan.

- (c) Those who have had dual nationalities including the Republic of China before the application, but no longer have the nationality of the Republic of China at the time of application, must submit a certificate of loss of the nationality of the Republic of China for eight years, approved by the Ministry of the Interior.

- c. Academic credentials:

The highest-level diploma and transcript issued by an overseas academic institution. These documents must be authenticated by a ROC embassy, consulate, representative office, another agency authorized by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (hereinafter referred to as "Taiwan's overseas agencies"), or verified by institutes established or appointed by, or through a private agency commissioned by, the Executive Yuan. (A copy of the translation in Chinese or English is necessary if the original diploma and transcript are in a language other than Chinese or English.)

- (a) Academic credentials from Mainland China: The Regulations Governing the Accreditation of Schools in Mainland China shall apply.
- (b) Academic credentials from Hong Kong or Macao: Academic Credential Verification and Accreditation Methods adopted in Hong Kong and Macao shall apply.
- (c) Academic credentials from other areas:
 - i. Academic credentials earned at overseas Taiwan schools or Taiwan schools in Mainland China shall be regarded as the same as those at domestic schools with equivalent levels.
 - ii. Academic credentials referred to the preceding 2 items shall be subject to the Regulations Regarding the Assessment and Recognition of Foreign Academic Credentials for Institutions of Higher Education. However, academic credentials earned from institutes or branches established in Mainland China by foreign schools shall require public notarization in Mainland China and be verified and examined by an institute established or appointed by, or through a private agency commissioned by the Executive Yuan.

* If the verification process is not completed before the application deadline, a signed deposition related to application documents (see **Appendix 6**) must be submitted with the application.

** At the time of registration, students must provide the original academic degree and transcript verified by a Taiwan overseas representative office, or verified by an institute established or appointed by, or through a private agency commissioned by, the Executive Yuan. If the related certificates cannot be submitted on time, the admissions offer will be revoked.

- d. A financial statement with a minimum balance of \$3,000 USD or a copy of a scholarship award notification (Please select one of the following payment methods). Except Indonesian students need to provide financial proof of 5,000USD.
 - (a) Photocopy of a financial statement that demonstrates financial sustainability for study in Taiwan (issued by a financial institution within the past three months).
 - (b) Proof of full scholarship provided by a government agency, university, college or private organization.
 - (c) Regardless of whether the applicant has received a government scholarship, they must provide proof of financial capability. Failure to provide this documentation may result in difficulties obtaining an entry visa to Taiwan.
- e. A Chinese or English study plan including learning motives, expected date of

- graduation, and expectation for the future.
- f. Two letters of recommendation. (For graduate program applicants only.)
 - g. Certificate of Chinese Proficiency: TOCFL Level 2 proficiency or other relevant certificates. (Native Chinese speakers are exempt from this stipulation.)
 - h. Checklist and Declaration for International Applicants Undertaking Studies in Taiwan (see **Appendix 3**)
 - i. Affidavit. (see **Appendix 4**)
 - j. Letter of Authority. (see **Appendix 5**)
 - k. Application fee: A copy of your bank's electronic transfer receipt or a postal money order.
 - l. Documents or Proof of Other Competences (optional).

4. Important Reminders

- (1) Applicant has never studied in the ROC as an Overseas Chinese student.
- (2) International students applying for schools in Taiwan shall be limited to one application only.
- (3) Applicants can apply for only one department and should make sure that they are qualified by checking all criteria provided by the department.
- (4) An international student who has completed a bachelor's degree or a higher degree in Taiwan and can apply for a master's program, provided that a graduate certificate and transcript for each consecutive semester issued from the educational institutions in Taiwan is enclosed.
- (5) International students who have graduated from private high schools, lower grade schools for international residents in Taiwan, bilingual programs affiliated with senior high schools, or from a foreign curriculum department and classes at private senior high schools or below must submit credentials and transcripts for each academic semester to apply for admission.
- (6) International students who have been forced to withdraw because of misconduct, academic failure, or criminal offenses from any educational institution in Taiwan are not allowed to apply for admission. Should any applicant be determined to have been withdrawn from any educational institute in Taiwan with such violation, the applicant's student status will be revoked immediately.
- (7) International students may not apply for continuing education bachelor's degree programs, part-time master's degree programs, or programs that are restricted to night or weekend classes. International students who have obtained legal resident status in Taiwan are exempt from this stipulation.
- (8) All the submitted application information should be clear and without mistakes. Applicants should be held fully responsible for any consequences arising from errors in application materials.

- (9) All the submitted application documents should be accurate and valid. If any of the above documents are found to be false, the applicant should be expelled and their diploma revoked if graduated.

5. Grading and review procedures

- (1) Grading items: total score=comprehensive scoring of the required application documents (100%).
- (2) Those who have passed the qualification review shall gather the application form and required documents, and send them to each department for review, and then submit to the admissions committee to be decided on the admission list.
- (3) Those who fail the qualification examination will not be admitted even though the department has quota available.

Note: OCU offers a letter of acceptance which includes name of the student, department, type of degree, medium of instruction, and date and year of entrance in both Chinese and English. Other details such as tuition, refund policies, and scholarships are posted on the school website.		

7. The Appeal Process

- (1) If the applicants have any concerns about admission matters or believes that there have been a violation of gender equality principles during the admission process (including gender, gender characteristics, gender identity, or sexual orientation discrimination), they should file a complaint with the school's Admissions Committee within two weeks of the release of results.
- (2) The complainant should submit a formal written complaint including their name, department of application, contact phone number, date, the facts and reasons for the complaint, the desired remedy, and attach any relevant documents or evidence.
- (3) Complaints will not be accepted under the following circumstances:
 - (a) When there are already clear regulations in the relevant laws or admission brochures.
 - (b) If the complaint is submitted after the specified deadline.

- (c) Complaints submitted without a valid name.
- (4) Accepted complaint cases will be handled by a Complaint Handling Team composed of members of the school's Admissions Committee. If necessary, the complainant or relevant individuals may be invited to attend and provide explanations.
- (5) Each complainant is limited to one complaint, and the results of the complaint handling will be communicated to the complainant by the Admissions Committee within one month.

8. Scholarship / Financial Aid Information

- (1) OCU International Student Scholarship
 - a. The various awards are as follows:
 - (a) Level I Award: Tuition and student fees covered.
 - (b) Level II Award: 1/2 of tuition and student fees covered.
 - (c) Level III Award: 1/3 of tuition and student fees covered.
 - (d) Level IV Award: 1/4 of tuition and student fees covered.
 - (e) Level V Award: Free campus housing provided.
 - b. Prospective international students have priorities.
 - c. Awards are provided for one semester; For Freshman first time application, it will be evaluated by in charge department to make decision on the award.
- (2) OCU Overseas Student Financial Aid
 - a. Every qualified student can obtain \$3,000 TWD per month for up to ten months per year.
 - b. Prospective overseas students have priorities.
- (3) Students must choose either Scholarship or Financial Aid.
- (4) Undergraduate students may obtain aid for four years.
Graduate students may obtain aid for two years.

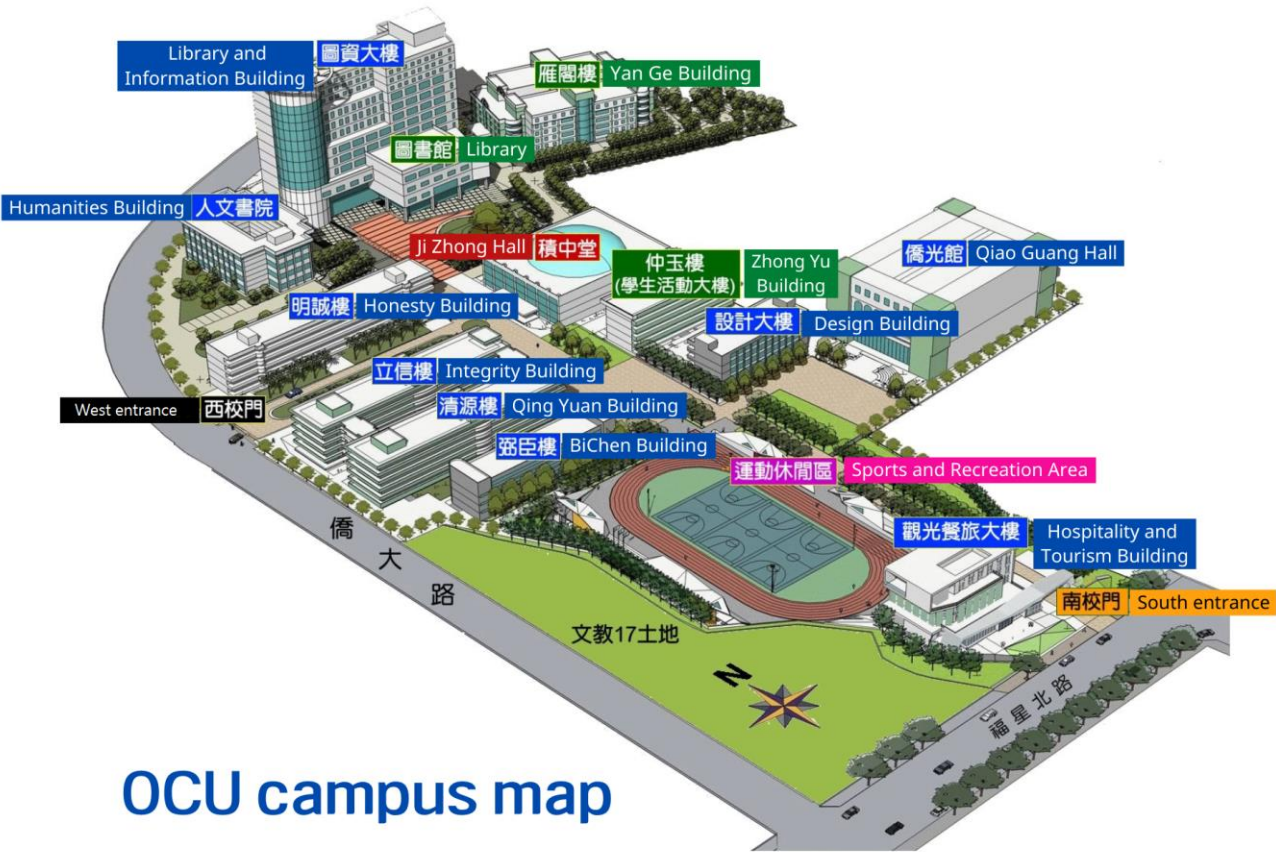

11. Remarks

- (1) Acceptance letters or admissions notices do not guarantee visa issuance. Visas are approved by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
- (2) After being offered admission, students must prepare all documents and credentials that can prove their requirements for enrollment. If the documents or credentials students offer are found false, students will be dismissed from the school, will not be granted any school certificates, and will be held criminally responsible. If students are found offering false documents or credentials after they have graduated, their academic degree will be cancelled. School will publicly cancel students' requirements for graduation.
- (3) International students are required to be covered by the six-month insurance arrangements made by OCU starting from the date of registration. Students who do not accept the insurance will not be allowed to continue enrollment.
- (4) Applicants, in accordance with the Personal Data Protection Law, will allow OCU to use their personal information for application and enrollment at OCU. OCU will keep applicants' personal information for the use of enrollment evaluation only. By submitting the application forms, applicants grant the school use of their personal information in aspects related to enrollment. Applicants' full names will be shown on the list of successful candidates. Their personal information will then be transferred to Registration.
- (5) International students will lose their international student status and shall be expelled from OCU if they obtain Taiwan residency or Republic of China citizenship status during their course of study.
- (6) Any details not mentioned or regulated in this prospect must conform to the laws or policy of the Ministry of Education, Overseas Chinese University Admission Committee, and Overseas Chinese University Academic Affairs Division.
- (7) **If there should be any discrepancy or contradiction, the Chinese version prevails.**

According to "Regulations Regarding Study and Counseling Assistance for Overseas Chinese Students in Taiwan," the term "overseas Chinese student" refers to a student of Chinese descent who has come to Taiwan to study, who was born and lived overseas until the present time, or who has been living overseas for six or more consecutive years in the immediate past and obtained permanent or long-term residency status overseas. Note that for those applying to study in the departments of medicine, dentistry, or Chinese medicine at Taiwan universities, the minimum required number of consecutive years of overseas residency is eight years.

The term "overseas" refers to locations or countries other than mainland China, Macao, and Hong Kong. The term "consecutive years of residency" is defined as Overseas Chinese Students staying in Taiwan for less than 120 days per calendar year. If the calculated calendar year is not one complete calendar year, the stay in Taiwan should not exceed 120 days within the calculated calendar year period.
